#### **Organizational Highlights**

JobTrain has partnered with several organizations to table at local job fairs targeting person who are justice involved, including young adults and former foster youth. Nonprofits partners like Work2Future, Access Systems, and Design4x are striving to place skilled workers into high earning jobs regardless of backgrounds. Community Legal Service of East Palo Alto (CLSEPA) offers free live scans events, legal aid for students, and the ability to obtain a copy of their arrest records. Legal services include expungement, immigration, housing evictions and consumer law.

Mental health and resilience We understand that there are many factors that influence a person's ability to attain economic and social well-being. That's why JobTrain provides wrap-around supportive services alongside our career development and training services to ensure that our people have every opportunity available to them to overcome challenges and gain full access to the jobs and careers they strive for.

JobTrain continues to expand its footprint throughout the San Francisco Bay Area, this past year adding an additional Career Center site to its portfolio. The Career Centers are embedded in communities and regions void of high-quality work readiness, job placement and career training programs. At our Career Centers we offer Resume Development, Interview Practice, Job Placement Services and Career Exploration, Online Job Readiness Workshops, Access to Virtual Employment Tools, Incentives for finding new jobs, Access to onsite technology: printer, laptops, free Wi-Fi, Connection to Supportive Services and information and registration for any of our career pathway training programs.

#### Career Development (Performance data is not yet available)

We provide our CTE students with a dedicated career development specialist (CDS), who assists with enrollment, professional development, and career coaching services, mandatory job readiness workshops, referrals to externships/internships, and guest presentations from employers (e.g. LinkedIn, Meta, Stanford, and Kaiser).

## Supportive Services (Performance data is not yet available)

JobTrain offers a wide range of support services to our students. Students enrolled in Career Education (CTE) have a dedicated Career Advisor who supports and oversees the enrollment process for each enrollee. Additionally, the CTE advisor provides support to students while they are in training, such as resume writing, interview prep, career advising and more. Since the COVID-19 pandemic the majority of student supportive services have been offered via Zoom or other online platforms. Currently JobTrain continues to provide supportive services online as well as in person. Support services provided to the students at JobTrain include:

- Childcare (in many cases in our on-site Child Development Center)
- Benefits Screening and assistance with public benefits (e.g., CalFresh, Medi-Cal, General Assistance)
- One on one financial counseling
- Legal Assistance (partner services with Community Legal Services of East Palo Alto CLSEPA) such as (e.g., expungement assistance, immigration, Workers Rights, consumer)
- Tax preparation (state and federal; EITC)
- Career advising & assessment: Career advisors offer these services to students while they are in training in their professional development sessions.
- Wellness/Mental Health support (provided by Stanford University School of Medicine and Tipping Point. Until 2022; referrals to community resources now provided by JobTrain staff)
- Food pantry referrals
- Legal assistance
- Housing Information
- Immigration Services
- Public Assistance information
- LIBRE project (support for undocumented students)
- Essential Skills Workshops that cover a variety of "soft-skills" topics such as Goal Setting, Financial Literacy, Workplace Success.
- Registration support and information on programs and classes (provided at Canada College satellite campus and other advanced training opportunities )
- Alumni Coaches support Assists CTE graduates with developing and navigating career pathways, such as advance training in their field, career planning, invitations to employer presentations and professional development, and personal development
